Pronouns are words that refer to "something else" – usually a noun – earlier in the sentence or in a previous sentence.

Jill watched her favorite movie.

In this example, "her" refers to Jill.

Pat walked his dog.

In this example, "his" refers to Pat.

The doctors found their stethoscopes.

In this example, "their" is referring to the doctors.

All is well when pronouns are used correctly; readers can then understand the intended meaning immediately. But, all too often, pronouns are used sloppily, and readers are uncertain what the pronoun is referring to. Here are some examples:

PRONOUN REFERENCE ERROR: Academic writing can be intimidating, especially when they only get negative feedback.

Who are "they"? The "they" pronoun is not referring to anything else. But, since the sentence is about academic writing, we can assume that "they" must be students.

CORRECTED: Academic writing can be intimidating, especially when students only get negative feedback.

PRONOUN REFERENCE ERROR: The book was well-written, and he did a good job of reinforcing the love theme.

Who is "he"? The writer probably means "the author" and should have written the sentence that way.

CORRECTED: The book was well-written, and the author did a good job of reinforcing the love theme.

CORRECTED: The book was well-written and contained a strong theme of love.

PRONOUN REFERENCE ERROR: I like to use the computer for spell check and grammar check, but I don't always use it.

Is "it" the computer? Spell check? Grammar check? Depending upon the answer to that question, any of the following versions could be correct:

CORRECTED: I like to use the computer's spell check and grammar check, but I don't always use it.

CORRECTED: I like to use the computer for spell check and grammar check, but I don't always use them.

CORRECTED: I like to use the computer for spell check and grammar check, but I don't always use spell check.

CORRECTED: I like to use the computer for spell check and grammar check, but I don't always use grammar check.
