

**All About Dogs:** Learn the basics of being a good dog owner, including how to brush teeth, clip nails and how to train your dog to be a good citizen.

**All Tied Up** – Learn how you can make your own twine rope and about the different kinds of knots, hitches, and bends there are. Make your very own rope to take home.

Students will use wheelchairs, vision goggles, ear plugs and will do some challenging activities. This experience will hopefully promote respect and empathy for people with disAbilities.

**Do You Believe In Magic?** - Have you ever wanted to learn magic and entertain your friends or family members? Well now is your chance with the magic session at Camp W. You will learn some basic magic skills and practice them with a professional magician. You will learn card tricks, rubber band tricks, ball tricks, and many more.

**Dodgeball** - Indulge in learning the basics of Dodge ball. The teamwork and strategy are more valuable factors in dodge ball than athletic skill and individual competitiveness. Anyone can play! Experience is countered by enthusiasm. Dodge ball promotes maximum social enjoyment.

**Fun with Legos™** -- Careers in the Building and Construction. Listen to people who work in these careers and then design Lego structures that relate to these careers. If you want your parents to see and photograph what you design and build, have them come to the Lunda Center by 10:30 so they can take pictures. What is built will be disassembled by 11 a.m. and returned to the containers. *You MUST sign up for the 1st and 2nd session. Actual Lego construction activity will begin in the second session.*

**Rescue 911 (Lifesaving Skills)** - Learn how to prevent an accident from turning into an emergency, by learning lifesaving skills. Use assessment techniques such as checking for a pulse, breathing, choking, and calling for help.

**Talking Hands (Sign Language)** – Get to know others without saying a word! Learn basic signing, representing words, animals, colors, and the outdoors.

**The Beat Goes On (Anatomy)**— Explore the parts of the heart using models and a hands-on dissection of a real sheep heart. *Offered First & Second Sessions Only*

**Woodworking Wonders (Wood Technics)** – Learn about woodworking by making a wooden project. (Note: If you have attended this class before and have made a toolbox, indicate on registration form if you would like to make another project.)
