What?

The Fax to Quit program gives the tobacco users the option of having a quit coach contact them to provide an individualized quitting intervention. Tobacco users no longer have to take the first step in calling the Quit Line.

The Quit Line offers a variety of services, including:

- Free telephone coaching for Wisconsin tobacco users who want to quit. Coaches will help with quit attempt planning, strategies for coping with urges, stress, and obtaining social support.
- Follow-up calls initiated by a Quit Line coach.
- Referrals to local tobacco treatment programs and services.
- Information for friends, family and others concerned about a tobacco user.

How?

- If you want to have a quit coach contact you directly, a Fax to Quit form can be filled out (Forms can be obtained by contacting Student Development Office, the Wellness Center, or the Counselors in the Welcome Center).
- Once the form has been faxed, a Wisconsin Quit Line coach will contact you within three days to talk with you about the quitting process, explain more about Quit Line services, and help you develop a personalized quit plan.

What?

The medical professionals at the Student Health Center can prescribe the nicotine replacement medication Burpropion.

How?

Call 608-785-8558 or stop by the Student Health Center to make an appointment with a medical professional.

How much does it cost?

- If you are carrying 6 or more credits at Western Technical College, each visit to see a medical professional at the Student Health Center will cost \$10. The medication Burpropion will cost around \$1 a day at the Health Center Pharmacy.
- If you are carrying less than 6 credits at Western Technical College and have paid the \$100 Student Health fee, each visit to see a medical professional at the Health Center will cost \$10. For more information about the \$100 Student Health fee, please contact Student Development Office located in Kumm 100. The medication Burpropion will cost around \$1 a day at the Health Center Pharmacy.

Is there financial assistance available?

What?

The State of Wisconsin Medicaid, BadgerCare, and SeniorCare Benefit program will pay for a doctor's visit for the sole purpose of tobacco dependence treatment. It does not require prior authorization for reimbursement.

Medicaid, BadgerCare, and SeniorCare Benefit programs cover the cost of the following nicotine replacement therapy:

- Bupropion (Zyban)
- Chantix
- Inhaler, nasal spray, and patch (legend nicotine patch)
- Combination therapy (more than one medication at one time)

Repeated courses of tobacco dependence treatment are allowed.

Group therapy, telephone and web-based counseling are not covered.

How?

Make an appointment with any Medicaid-certified Wisconsin physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, or other staff who is under the direct on-site supervision of a physician.

Get a prescription.

Go to your local pharmacy and receive medications.

What?

This program offers discounts on Chantix, Nicotrol Inhaler, and Nasal Spray. In some cases, medications are free.

How?

- You must be an uninsured U.S. resident.
- Talk to your doctor about completing an application together.
- If approved, Pfizer will ship a three-month supply of medications to your doctor's office for pickup in three weeks. You must apply for each refill.

What?

This program may help to cover the cost of Zyban and Bupropion.

How?

- You must be a U.S. resident without prescription drug benefits. Your household income must be: \$19,599 or less if you are single; \$26,400 or less if you live with one other person; \$33,200 for a family of three; \$39,996 for a family of four.
- Talk to your doctor about completing an application together.
- If approved, you may pick up your medications at a local drug store. You will get a supply to last you two months. Your doctor can sign you up for one refill to last three additional months. Every year, you must submit a new form and call a hotline to receive more medication.

What?

This program offers savings on the Nicotine Inhaler and Nicotine Nasal Spray (Nicotrol) as well as Varenicline (Chantix).

How?

- This program is for legal U.S. residents with no health insurance and who are not eligible for Medicare. You must have a household income equal or less than: \$30,000 for a single person; \$40,000 for a family of two; \$50,000 for a family of three; \$60,000 for a family of four; \$70,000 for a family of five.
- You may enroll by mail or through the Together RX Access website.
