How can I receive specific information about my transfer options at Western?

Will I be able to receive financial aid?

- For information on a student's federal student loan balance and who to contact with questions, please visit www.nslsds.ed.gov. Click on the "Financial Aid Review" tab. You will need to log in using your FSA ID and password. Information with student loan balances will appear. By clicking on the number(s) that precede the loan types, student will see the name and telephone number of the loan servicer. The loan servicer is who to call regarding any questions a student might have regarding their student loans.

- Students who intend to enroll for the spring 2017 semester are eligible to apply for all types of financial aid.
- Each student's eligibility for additional federal student aid funds will need to be evaluated independently. Please contact Lacey Hemmersbach by calling 608-785-9884 and she will arrange an appointment with a Western Financial Aid Advisor.

Can I get credit for my Globe University courses?

We want to give you as much credit as possible. You will meet with our Credit for Prior Learning specialist to look at the knowledge and skills you have gained from previous education or training, military experience, volunteer, life and work experiences. What is the next step to apply/transfer to Western?

1. Fill out a Western Admissions Application.
 - Print and complete the application at www.westerntc.edu/apply.
 - Apply in-person at the Admissions office in the Welcome Center, 400 7th Street N., La Crosse or at a Regional location.
 - Application fee is waived for current Globe transferring students.
2. Supply Western with your Globe transcript. An unofficial transcript is acceptable if you have difficulty obtaining an official transcript from Globe.

**Please note: certain academic/training programs may require additional steps. Enrollment representatives can assist you with understanding your specific application requirements.*

Does Western offer associate and bachelor degrees like Globe?

Western offers associate degree, technical diploma, and short-term certificate programs that fully equip students with skills that can be immediately applied to the workforce. For those whose sights are set on furthering their education at a four-year college or university, numerous transfer agreements exist. See page 3 for a list of programs that are similar to Globe's programs.

What is the cost of tuition at Western?

For associate's degrees and technical diplomas (Wisconsin and Minnesota residents):

- Tuition: \$130.35 per credit
- Fees: \$11.41 per credit
- Additional material fees vary depending upon the course.
