## Documentation of Dislocated Worker/Displaced Homemaker Status Student

When you completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), you indicated that someone in your household (i.e. you or your spouse) is a dislocated worker.

In general, a person may be considered a dislocated worker if he or she is receiving unemployment benefits due to being laid off or losing a job and is unlikely to return to a previous occupation; has been laid off or received a layoff notice from a job; was self-employed but is now unemployed due to economic conditions or natural disaster; or is a displaced homemaker. A displaced homemaker is generally a person who previously provided unpaid services to a family (i.e. a stay-at-home mom or dad), is no longer supported by the husband or wife, is unemployed or underemployed, and is having trouble finding or upgrading employment.

Please provide supporting documentation of dislocated worker status.

Types of supporting documentation that are acceptable include unemployment compensation statement, letter from employer, or signed statement if self-employed. If you are a displaced homemaker; set up an appointment with Lori Mohring, Counselor in Enrollment Services 608.785.9553.
