Incarcerated Now

According to federal regulation, a student is considered incarcerated if he/she is serving a criminal sentence in a federal, state or local penitentiary, prison, jail, reformatory, work farm, or similar correctional institution (whether it is operated by the government or a contractor). No student who is incarcerated may receive Title IV student loan funds, and no student who is incarcerated in a Federal or State penal institution may receive Federal Pell Grant funds. However, an incarcerated student might be eligible for Pell, FSEOG, and FWS, but not Direct Loans or Perkins Loans, if he/she is incarcerated in a juvenile justice facility, a local or county jail, or a local or county penitentiary or correctional facility. A student is not considered incarcerated if he/she is in a half-way house or home detention or is sentenced to serve only weekends.
