Pebruary 2007. That was when the first steps were taken to form an Alumni Association Board at Western, starting with the creation of a taskforceconsisting of alumni representing our diverse alumni population. They completed a strategic plan and bylaws for the formation of the new Board, laying the groundwork for the coming decade.

In September 2007, the first Alumni Association Board meeting was held. Ten years later, we asked early members about their memories of that exciting time, the Board's accomplishments so far, and hopes for the future of the Board and Alumni Association.

"Personally, it was an opportunity for reconnection with the college," said Tina (Olson) Johns, '91 Medical Administrative Specialist. "I hadn't been involved since I graduated. I also saw it as a group of alums who could help other alums. It was about having a voice that can impact the future of the college."

When asked what has been achieved, Mary Jo Klos, '80 Nursing and past Alumni Board president reflected, "An increased understanding and awareness of the functions of the Alumni Association and the Board. I recall being a graduate and hearing about the Alumni Association and thinking that was not something for me until 'later' - not realizing all of the potential support and help that was really there for me at the time.

"My hopes and dreams for the future are that this Board and Association has unlimited potential to become even greater," continued Mary Jo. "Interactions with the administration, students, faculty, and community can be even more enhanced and result in members being even stronger ambassadors for the college and all it represents. Sally Emerson, Alumni Relations Coordinator, has been the glue that has kept us together and guided us to grow and strengthen."

"I really like the diversity we see in the Board, in age, gender, program areas, and employer representation," said Lynn (Smyrk) Lenz, '86 Respiratory Therapy Technician. "I also really enjoyed the Western alumni event at Gundersen Medical Center. It was impactful to see how many of my coworkers at the time were Western grads. I had no idea!"

Lynn proudly added, "It gives me goosebumps when I think about how the College has grown and changed from the new buildings to the courtyard to our efforts in sustainability. When the community was asked for \$79.8 million in support and people said 'yes,' that says so much about how people view the College and its importance in their community."

"Watching Western grow and change in the 40 years since I graduated has been done with pride. You see the Welcome Center, the Lunda Center, Cleary Courtyard, Union Market, the list goes on. Our college looks so good," said Cinda.

Welcome President Stanford



After 28 years under the leadership of Lee Rasch, EdD, Western has a new president. Roger Stanford, PhD, of La Crosse, Wis., was selected from a pool of 35 candidates. His tenure began July 1, 2017 as Western's seventh president.

Dr. Stanford was most recently the Vice President of Academic Affairs at Western Technical College, a position he had held since 2015. Previously, he was the Vice President of Instruction at Chippewa Valley Technical College (CVTC). He served at CVTC as a faculty member in Marketing and later as the Dean of Business, a Title III Grant Director, the Dean of Curriculum and Staff Development, and the Director of College Professional Development. As a graduate of CVTC, he also served on the Alumni Association Board for many years. He was an adjunct professor/ facilitator/research advisor for the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse Masters in Professional Education program and the University of Wisconsin-River Falls Masters in Education program. Dr. Stanford spent 10 years teaching in K-12 prior to moving into higher education.

Stanford holds a doctorate in philosophy in Curriculum and Instruction from Capella University, a master's degree in Teacher Education and Professional Development from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, a bachelor's degree in Marketing Education from the University of Wisconsin-Stout, and an associate's degree in Marketing Management from CVTC.

"I'm both humbled and honored to have been selected to lead this great college," said Stanford. "Western has a stellar reputation in the district and the state for high-quality education, and has even garnered national attention for leading-edge sustainability efforts. I look forward to sharing my experience and continuing the momentum for many years to come."

Filmmaker With Ambitious Goals

For generations, Hmong folktales and cultural history have been verbally passed down in the Hmong language. Western alumna, Bao Xiong, learned the stories of her Hmong ancestors from her parents. However, she soon discovered many Hmong children in La Crosse now speak only English, thus unable to understand their grandparents' stories. Since the stories are shared verbally, it makes them unique and yet vulnerable to face extinction.

Being in the Visual Communications program at Western, she aspired to create a short film, engaging the aging Hmong population by recording their stories then translating to English. In this way, local Hmong students will be able to better connect to their heritage. Her goal is to show the film locally through the school district, college courses, and other community learning opportunities.

After winning several awards for previous work, Xiong was invited to present her film at the Cannes Film Festival in France for future film opportunities, but participation would require funding.

Instructor, Lisa Heise, who helped Xiong raise money by making and selling egg rolls in Heise's home, brought the additional need to Jacqueline Schreiner of the Western Foundation. Through a funding opportunity with the La Crosse Community Foundation she was awarded a \$5,000 grant to continue her project, Stories We Tell. Other individuals also donated to her efforts.

Xiong attended the Cannes Film Festival in May and had a great experience, networking and connecting with directors, actors, and others in the industry. As part of the Cannes program, she was an intern with Lions Gate Entertainment Corp., where she was exposed to the business side of filmmaking.



Western and Ashley Furniture Announce Partnership



Students in Western Technical College's Electromechanical Technology program, as well as incumbent workers, will soon have the opportunity to receive training on state-of-the-art robots and simulated trainers, thanks to a new partnership with Ashley Furniture Industries.

Six robots along with three simulator units will be placed in the Ashley Furniture Industrial Automation Lab inside Western's newly constructed Integrated Technology Center on the La Crosse campus. In addition, a portable training robot will be housed at the Independence Campus.

In addition to the donation of the robots, the Ron and Joyce Wanek Foundation has made a donation to Western's Foundation that will allow Western faculty to become certified on the equipment. Western will be the only technical college in this region with both the automation lab and the instructor certification required to fully train all levels of robotic technicians.

Western Receives Workforce Advancement Training Grants for 11 Area Businesses



Western Technical College will receive \$325,000 in Workforce Advancement Training grants to upgrade the skills of workers at 11 companies in the 7 Rivers Region. Local companies included in Western's partnership, include Advanced Fiber Products (La Crosse), Ashley Furniture (Arcadia), Badger Mining (Taylor), DuraTech (La Crosse), GEA (Galesville), Hi-Crush (Blair), Interior Systems (La Crosse), La Crosse Seed (La Crosse), Norwinn Company (Galesville), Walker

Engineered Products (New Lisbon), and Westby Cooperative Creamery (Westby).

Employees will receive leadership and supervisory training, technical skills in electromechanical maintenance, robotics, project management, and computer engineering and design as part of customized training programs developed for grant recipients. Additionally, a consortium group of long-term care providers in the district will be able to take advantage of CNA and medication aid training for their staff.

Student Ambassador Named

Amanda Coughlin has been selected as the 2017-18 Western Technical College Student Ambassador, an official spokesperson for Western and the Wisconsin Technical College System.

Coughlin is a second-year student in the IT-Computer Support Specialist program. Coughlin chose Western because of her

previous experience with the college. She earned her HSED through Western and enrolled in an academic program to earn her college degree. And while her first program choice was not the right fit for her, she found the IT-Computer Support Specialist program and hasn't looked back.

In addition to her classes, she has held work-study positions in the Media Center and in PC Services, tutors on campus, and works part-time. She has been involved in student government and served as a student club leader. She is also a Presidents Scholarship recipient and mother of one.
