THIS ARTICULATION AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") by and between Western Technical College (the "College"), with a principal business address at 400 Seventh Street North La Crosse, WI 54601 and Viterbo University ("VU"), with a principle business address at 900 Viterbo Drive, WI 54601. The College and VU desire to enter into this Agreement pursuant to which students of the College would be eligible for articulated course credits and/or program requirement(s) satisfaction at VU, according to the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

ACCORDINGLY, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants contained in this Agreement, and of other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the College and VU (both or either of which may hereinafter be referred to respectively as the "Parties" or a "Party") agree as follows:

1. Description of Articulation Program.

- a. <u>Definitions</u>. Articulation Criteria and Articulation Benefits are defined on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- b. <u>Accreditation of the College</u>. The College warrants that it is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. The College will notify VU if such accreditation ceases to exist.
- c. <u>Accreditation of VU</u>. VU warrants that it is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. VU will notify the College if such accreditation ceases to exist.
- d. Admissions Processing. For those students who meet the Articulation Criteria in Exhibit A, VU will consider their applications for admission in accordance with standard VU admission application evaluation criteria, while recognizing students' accomplishments at the College.
- e. <u>Non-Exclusivity</u>. This Agreement is not exclusive, and either Party may enter into similar agreements with any other Party.

2. Term and Termination.

- a. <u>Term.</u> The Term of this Agreement is from the Effective Date until terminated by either party. The Parties may agree to review the agreement every five years. Termination of the agreement may be made by either as set forth in Section 2 (b).
- b. <u>Termination</u>. Termination may be made by either party without cause or in the event of a material breach by the other Party, effective upon the later date to occur of (i) the next admission application and review period of VU, or (ii) the date that is ninety (90) days after the notice that includes a description of the breach.
- c. <u>Post-Termination</u>. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason, College students previously accepted by or admitted to VU shall continue to receive the benefits contemplated by this Agreement and the VU catalog rights from the term in which they were admitted to VU for a period not to exceed [number] years.

3. 3. Miscellaneous.

a. <u>Notices</u>. All notices or other written communications relating to termination, expiration, or any other legal matter relating to this Agreement will be effective when received by either Party at the following address (or to such other address as such Party may substitute, by providing a written notice in the manner specified in this Section)

- b. Waivers and Amendments. The waiver by either Party of any provision of this Agreement on any occasion and upon any particular circumstance shall not operate as a waiver of such provision of this Agreement on any other occasion or upon any other circumstance. This Agreement may be modified or amended only via a writing signed by both Parties.
- c. <u>Publicity</u>. The Parties may refer to their affiliation as established in this Agreement in their respective catalogs, brochures and other information distributed to the public.
- d. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither Party may assign its rights or delegate its duties under this Agreement. Any attempted assignment or delegation in violation of this Section would be null and void.
- e. <u>Complete Agreement: Integration</u>. This Agreement contains the complete understanding of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all other agreements, understandings, communications and promises of any kind, whether oral or written, between the Parties with respect to such subject matter.
- f. <u>Counterparts: Facsimile Signatures.</u> This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, all of which shall be originals and which together shall constitute a single agreement. For the purpose of interpreting this Agreement, facsimile signatures shall be considered equivalent to original signatures.
- g. <u>Independent Contractors</u>. The Parties are independent contractors, and no agency, partnership, franchise, joint venture, or employment relationship is intended or created by this Agreement. Neither Party shall make any commitment, or give the impression that it has authority to make any commitment, on behalf of the other Party.

Articulation Criteria are:

- 1. Completion of the Applied Science in Human Services program at Western Technical College. The degree must have been earned May 2013 or later.
- 2. Achieving a minimum of a 2.5 gpa on a 4.0 system.
- 3. Students must earn 120 semester credit hours and 40 upper division (300 and 400 level) credits total to meet graduation requirements.
- 4. Credits earned must fulfill all general education core requirements, mission seminars, pre-requisites for a social work major, core social work major requirements, and social work major support courses.
- 5. All transferred coursework must earn a grade of C or better.
- 6. Students must complete the final 30 credits of their degree at Viterbo University.
- Students must complete and/or have transferred in the following degree requirements for the BA or BS degree as outlined in the catalog in which the student enters Viterbo University.
- 8. This agreement may be updated at any point pending degree requirement changes at Western Technical College and/or Viterbo University.
- 9. Any new courses developed following approval of this agreement will be reviewed for equivalency and transfer.
- 10. Students must apply and be admitted to the professional phase of the Viterbo University Social Work Program. Admission to Viterbo University does not guarantee admission to the professional phase of the social work major.

Admission Process for WTC Human Service Associate Degree transfer students to Professional Phase:

- 1. Viterbo students required to apply by February 1st. WTC students can apply later, but the sooner the better so we can plan for enough sections.
- 2. Admission Requirements:
 - a. Complete the Viterbo University Application and be accepted to Viterbo University.
 - b. Complete a minimum of 30 credits that transfer to Viterbo. If the Human Services Degree is not completed by the time of acceptance to the Professional Phase then contact Jennifer Anderson-Meger for additional information.
 - c. Complete Human Biology with grade of C or better. (Course may be in progress at time of application.)
 - d. 2.5 cumulative GPA
 - e. Grade of B or better in SOWK 210 Introduction to Social Work (10520101 Introduction to Human Services-3cr. at WTC)
 - f. Complete online application: http://www.viterbo.edu/social-work/student-handbooks-and-admission-information
 - g. Submit sample of academic writing upload to online application
 - h. Submit personal statement directions on the online application upload to the online application
 - i. Complete WTC Human Service Associate Degree and send final WTC transcript to Viterbo University before starting fall classes.
